



## WHAT DOES A WORKFORCE BOARD DO?

Oversee job training programs for individuals and businesses to **increase skills, employment opportunities, and business productivity.**

## HOW?

Through several NCWorks Career Centers and sometimes the board’s business engagement staff will manage special projects directly.

## ANNUAL BUDGET (WIOA only)

Approx. \$6M for adult, dislocated worker, and youth



## WHATS’ GOING ON RIGHT NOW?

**Catalyst 20/20:** Companies can get up to \$20K to train existing workers in whatever they deem critical to business.

**Roads to Reentry:** . \$1.5M grant to provide career readiness support, education and training to 188 individuals reentering the workforce.

Coming from Wake Correctional Center, Johnston Correctional Institute, and N.C. Correctional Institute for Women or others where individuals are returning to Johnston and Wake upon release.

- 25 or older; no sex offenses other than prostitution
- Program operator: Eckerd Connects

**New Youth Advisory Council:** A partnership of leaders that will support creation of an education-to-career system that enables every young person to

- Graduate from high school
- Engage in work experiences
- Complete a post-secondary credential
- Secure living wage work
