#### **NCWorks Incumbent Worker Training Grant**

When workers don't have the skills necessary to keep up with the demands of the business, the results can be unfortunate for everyone. NCWorks IW provides employers the means to address skill gaps which increases the employability of the worker. These gaps can occur because of changing job responsibilities and requirements and sometimes result in job loss. Training funded by this grant should result in increased knowledge, certifications, and provide a competitive edge for the employer.

#### **Program basics**

- Up to \$10,000\* per project with a lifetime maximum of \$40,000
- Application periods occur twice per year
- For-profit and non-profit entities are eligible
- Organizations must have been operating in NC for the preceding 12 months
- Multiple businesses with common training needs can submit a collaborative application

## ON THE JOB TRAINING (OJT) 🚿

OJT helps businesses mitigate costs associated with training new hires. We streamline the process by supplying qualified applicants. The business trains the individual for a specific position and we reimburse up to 50% of the wages paid during the training period. The length of the training period depends on the existing skills of the candidate and there is no limit to the number of applicants that can participate. There is also no wage maximum.
